

**ROAD COMMITTEE
MINUTES OF MEETING
August 11th, 2026
4:30 P.M.**

Present: Mike Holley, Russell Wade and Nathan Pilgreen. Absent: Curtis Moses. Also present: Glenn Hutto, Ben Bridges, Jeremy Hobbs, Brenda Abercrombie, A.J. Ford, Jr., Danielle Harkins, Shane Abercrombie, Linda Hammett and Scott Williams.

Mr. Holley called the meeting to order. Mr. Wade led the group in prayer.

Public Comment on agenda items – No comments were made.

Motion Mr. Wade, seconded by Mr. Pilgreen to amend the agenda as follows:

- **#8 Discuss and make recommendations, if necessary, regarding a speed limit for Loch Lomond Road**

Motion Mr. Wade, seconded by Mr. Pilgreen and declared adopted by unanimous vote of the Committee to approve the agenda as written.

Motion Mr. Pilgreen, seconded by Mr. Wade to approve the minutes of the April 14th, 2026 meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Holley presented a request from the Town of Farmerville for assistance with repairs to West Street and the roadway serving 607 Franklin Street, Units A, B, and C, located on the west side of Farmerville.

Mr. Holley, Mr. Wade, and the Road Superintendent inspected the requested areas. Mr. Holley expressed concern regarding whether the roadway serving 607 Franklin Street, Units A, B, and C, is a municipal street or privately owned property and questioned whether the Police Jury would have the authority to perform work at that location.

Mr. Holley asked the Jurors who were not members of the committee whether they had any objections to performing the requested road repairs. Mrs. Abercrombie inquired whether the roads are located within the Town of Farmerville. She stated that she would not support the requested repairs unless the Town of Farmerville agreed to pay for the materials. Mr. Pilgreen and Mr. Hobbs also stated that they would not support the requested road repairs unless the Town of Farmerville paid for the materials.

Mr. Wade suggested the Town of Farmerville be treated like any other municipality. The Jury will provide the labor and equipment (if owned) and the Town of Farmerville can pay for the materials. If the Town of Farmerville would like a spreader, then they should be responsible for those costs incurred. The cost of materials for West Street would be approximately \$8,000.

Motion Mr. Wade, seconded by Mr. Pilgreen to recommend to the full jury to assist the Town of Farmerville with West Street; Town of Farmerville to pay for the cost of materials and pay for the cost of a spreader if desired. The work will be performed as time permits. Motion carried unanimously.

No discussion was held regarding DOTD and state roads.

The Road Superintendent gave a brief update on the 2026 Road Priority Program. All of the priority roads are done except for chip sealing – tar/rock. The 2026 Program should be completed within three (3) weeks.

Motion Mr. Pilgreen, seconded by Mr. Wade to recommend to the full jury to implement a 25 MPH speed limit at the intersection of Gilmore Road/Loch Lomond Road and at the intersection of Longfield Cemetery/Loch Lomond Road. Motion carried unanimously.

There being no more business to come before the committee, Mr. Holley declared the meeting adjourned upon motion by Mr. Pilgreen and duly seconded by Mr. Wade on this the 11th day of August, 2026.
